Bob Greig's Tips for Spring Soil Preparation



LIME -- use high-calcium lime, rather than dolomite lime (unless your soil test recommends otherwise) You have to ask specifically for it in the stores and check bag labels.

NITROGEN-- use fishbone meal (earthworms love it). It is also wonderful source of phosphate, calcium, and trace minerals.

TRANSPLANTING - as you transplant, try mixing in one of their microbe inoculants for minimizing shock and increasing vigor, plus stimulate mycorrhizal development for strong root systems.

SOLUBLE KELP POWDER is an excellent source of trace elements & potassium or K. Spray this kelp to ward off damping off of seedlings, reduce transplant shock, and resist fungal and bacterial diseases in the greenhouse.
